Bird Checklist Of Cullinan Park

Cullinan Park is located in the Brazos River bottom. The heavy and fertile soil originally held a great forest and cane ticket which was cleared for cotton and cattle production. Today the area is dominated by small trees and thickets. The lakes are man-made or old channels of the Brazos River which host a wide variety of water and insectivorous birds. Osprey’s dive into the lakes for fish, herons and egrets stalk the shallows, gallinules and coots swim about, swallows feed above the lake, flycatchers sally from trees and scrubs to catch insects. Notable birds include elusive but common Wood Ducks, rare Couch’s Kingbirds and rare Great Kiskadee. This list includes 209 species of birds and counting.

The **Houston Parks Board** and the **City of Houston** welcome you to Cullinan Park. The Cullinan Park Conservancy was founded as a non-profit, tax-exempt corporation in late 2010 by citizens interested in the Park, who were committed to enhancing and protecting its natural beauty, for the use and enjoyment of wildlife and human visitors alike. The Conservancy is focused on the Park's legal protection, master-planning, plant and wildlife surveys, trail and bridge maintenance, and organization of cleanups, photo contests, bird counts, and other fun, outdoor activities.
